## **Attitudes, Values and Lifestyles in the Student Environment**

## **Conclusions:**

- 1. The majority of the students (approximately 60%) consider themselves as being religious, the rest are indifferent or atheists. A relatively small number (9%) display a definite un-religious (atheist) attitude.
- 2. The religiousness of the students tends to be rather passive, "in the background", manifested in the shape of a "belief in God" while the religious behavior (prayer, attending church) is a lot less present.
- 3. With respect to the role of the church in the life of the Romanian society, 62% of the students think that it should be small or very small and 3% don't see any role for it.

The following table shows the significant religious convictions and behaviors of the students and supports the above conclusions:

- 4. There are significant distinctions in the attitude towards religion by sex. Female students are more religious than male students.
- 5. The other nationalities are characterized by an institutional religious participation that's greater that the Romanians'.
- 6. The children of peasants and blue collar workers have a higher degree of religiousness than the children of officers and intellectuals do.
- 7. Students that reside in the city tend to show a lower religiousness degree than those that reside in the village.
